



**Counseling and Mental Health**

Credit: 1

Students model the knowledge and skills necessary to pursue a counseling and mental health career through simulated environments. Students are expected to apply knowledge of ethical and legal responsibilities, limitations, and the implication of their actions.

This course will enable students to investigate careers in the human services career cluster, including counseling and mental health, early childhood development, family and community, and personal care services. Cosmetology I PEIMS: 13025200 Grade Placement: 11

Cosmetology II PEIMS: 13025300 Grade Placement: 12

Prerequisite: Cosmetology I, own transportation

Credit: 3

This two-year program provides students with job specific training for entry-level employment in cosmetology careers. It includes sterilization and sanitation processes, shampooing and rinsing hair, application of conditioning creams and color rinses, application of scalp and hair treatments, shaping and thinning hair, hairstyling, permanent waving, hair coloring, manicuring, facial massage, facial makeup, entrepreneurship, safety, leadership and career opportunities. In the second year this program continues with information and skills necessary to prepare for the Texas State Licensing Board of Cosmetology exam.
