

Practicum- Certified Nursing Assistant / Phlebotomy

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Course Description

The Certified Nursing Assistant program is designed to provide students with skilled training and preparation for the nursing profession. Students will develop skills to provide quality assessment and care for patients. Students are required to participate in practical training at a local long-term care facility. In the Phlebotomy course students will learn to draw blood by using artificial arms and eventually working up to draw blood from each other. Successful completion of these programs will prepare the student for college courses in the medical field. Students must possess a social security card for testing and will be required to undergo a criminal background check prior to practical training at designated nursing facility.
