Courses offered through the College Board’s Advanced Placement program enable students to pursue college level coursework while still in high school. Based on participation in courses and AP Exam performance, students can gain college admission, earn scholarship awards, earn credit toward a college degree, skip introductory college classes, enter higher-level classes, and/or fulfill general college educational requirements, depending on the college or university.

PM Exams/11:30 am

REGULAR EXAM COST:

Approximately \$86 per exam

AP SEMINAR EXAM COST:

Approximately \$134

**Online registration will begin in November 2017 and final payments for exams will be due at the beginning of March 2018.*

Students have the opportunity to earn college credit by scoring well on their AP exams.

Colleges and universities determine the scores students must receive on AP exams to earn college credit at their schools.
