

Animation I and II



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Course Description

Animation I and II students apply art and technology to create visually rich 2D and 3D animations. In this art-intensive course, students will study object physics and human motion, and put them in motion using high-end, professional animation software. Animation requires a high level of thinking and consideration of movement and form. In this class, students pay very close attention to detail and meticulously craft combinations of form, movement, and sound. Students will be using software from Adobe and Autodesk to sketch, model, and sculpt characters and environments that entertain and inform. Animation I and II students will have the opportunity to qualify for Adobe and Autodesk certification and will also explore diverse animation colleges and careers.
