Marine Creek Choirs and Course Description:

Beginner/ 6th **Grade Treble Choir -** This class is for 6th grade girls and will focus on the basics of vocal technique, music theory, sight reading, and music performance. This class meets 5th & 8th periods.

Beginner/ 6th Grade Boys Choir - This class is for 6th grade boys and will focus on the basics of vocal technique, music theory, sight reading, and music performance. This class meets 6th period.

Intermediate/ JV Treble Choir - This choir is for developing 7th & 8th Grade female singers. This choir is for singers who have some music experience, but may be needing some development in technique. This course continues to develop vocal technique, music theory, sight reading, and music performance while introducing more advanced concepts and literature. This class meets 7th period.

Intermediate/ JV Boys Choir –This choir is for developing 7th & 8th Grade male singers. This choir is for singers who have some music experience, but may be needing some development in technique. This course continues to develop vocal technique, music theory, sight reading, and music performance while introducing more advanced concepts and literature. This class meets 2nd period.

Varsity Treble Choir - This choir is for more experienced singers and music readers. Students are placed into this choir based on director recommendation only. A strong work ethic and positive attitude are a must! Students have the opportunity to work up to this ensemble at semester as well as be moved downward, based on work ethic or poor grades. This course offers accelerated study of vocal technique, music theory, sight reading, and music performance. Students in Varsity Treble are expected to be leaders and will be working extensively on performance of solo/small ensemble/and advanced choral literature. **Students in this choir will be expected to either audition for region choir or participate in Solo and Ensemble competition.** This class meets 4th period

Varsity Boys Choir - This choir is for more experienced singers and music readers. Students are placed into this choir based on director recommendation only. A strong work ethic and positive attitude are a must! Students have the opportunity to work up to this ensemble at semester as well as be moved downward, based on work ethic or poor grades. This course offers accelerated study of vocal technique, music theory, sight reading, and music performance. Students in Varsity Boys are expected to be leaders and will be working extensively on performance of solo/small ensemble/and advanced choral literature. **Students in this choir will be expected to either audition for region choir or participate in Solo and Ensemble competition.** This class meets 3rd period

It is important to note that choirs at MCMS are not chosen, and students are not placed based solely on talent, but more-so experience, attitude, and behavior. I do not rank my choirs and I strive to place students based on where will be most developmentally beneficial to them.

Essential Elements and Goals:

It is important that my students grow as **musicians** and not just as singers. For this reason, we spend instruction time on many things in addition to just singing our repertoire. Some of these lessons include:

- 1. Study of vocal techniques
- 2. Music Theory
- 3. Ear Training
- 4. Sight-singing or Sight-reading
- 5. Creative self-expression
- 6. Performance skills
- 7. Concert etiquette
- 8. Appreciation of all performing arts
- 9. Development of responsibility, citizenship, self-discipline, and positive self-esteem
- 10. Development of personal standards for teamwork in rehearsal and group performances
- 11. Music History and study of composers

Grading Policy:

Six-week grades are computed in the following manner:

40% Major Grades (Including Concerts, Tests, and quizzes)

60% Daily Grades (Including participation and small assignments, as well as smaller written quizzes and assessments)

Most of my daily grades are taken from classroom participation. Proper classroom participation consists of following the classroom expectations (outlined later), and performing all duties of a choir member as instructed by me (the director). Refusal to sing and participate in an appropriate manner will result in low participation grades. Daily grades can also consist of written assignments.

Each of the **REQUIRED CONCERTS** (see calendar) **TEST GRADES**. Concert test grades are determined in the following manner:

- 1. 15% Arriving on time and being in your chair in the auditorium.
- 2. 15% Dressing in the correct uniform, making sure that all parts of the uniform are present and extra parts are not!
- 3. 10% Listening quietly to the other choirs and following audience behavior expectations.
- 4. 10% Walking on and off stage correctly.
- 5. 50% Performing on stage in the manner that has been instructed.

Quiz grades are earned in several ways. Singing and sight reading quizzes may be given throughout the year to monitor the progress of each student. Written quizzes also may be given.

Students who participate with energy, enthusiasm, and cooperation make excellent grades in choir!

Concerts:

Concerts are a very important display of all of our hard work in the MCMS Choir Program. Please see the calendar on the attached sheet and note the dates of our concerts on your family calendar. Concerts are a required part of the MCMS Choir Program and are graded events. Marine Creek Middle School staff work very hard to minimize and overcome conflicts with other MCMS activities. These issues **will be worked out** between the director and other MCMS sponsors and will therefore **NOT** be considered excused absences. Concerts are considered by the State of Texas to be **CO-CURRICULAR** not extra-curricular. Absences that are considered **UNEXCUSED** and will result in a test grade of zero include (but are not limited to):

- Transportation problems
- Babysitting siblings
- Doctor appointments
- Family vacations
- NON-MARINE CREEK MS Athletic, Cheer, or Dance events

Once again, these reasons for absence are **NOT-EXCUSEABLE.** If your child is having an issue with one of these, it is the responsibility of the student and the parent to find a solution **BEFORE** the concert. If there is an **EMERGENCY** conflict the day of the concert, such as severe illness or family death, the parent of the student is required to inform the director **in writing** as soon as possible.

Choir Uniforms:

The mandatory uniforms for choir members are detailed below. It is important to note that there are parts of each uniform that are provided by your child's Choir Fee, and others that are not provided and are expected to be provided by the student.

Uniforms:

Girls: Black formal dresses that are owned by the Marine Creek Chorale. Each girl will need to supply black close-toed dress shoes to complete the uniform and may wear makeup or small/stud earrings.

<u>Boys:</u> Black tuxedo shirt that is purchased from the Marine Creek Chorales, black dress pants, and navy neck ties that are owned by the Marine Creek Chorale. **All boys will need to provide black dress shoes (no tennis shoes) and black socks.**

All uniforms will be turned in to the Choir Director at the end of the year and dry-cleaned BY MARINE CREEK CHOIRS. Failure to turn in their uniform will result in a fee being placed on your child's account for the amount to replace the uniform.

Choir Expectations:

Rules

- 1. Be respectful. Treat yourselves, each other, the Director, and materials with respect.
- 2. Students are expected to be in their assigned seat with their choir folder, and pencil when the bell rings.
- 3. Keep hands, feet, and all objects to yourself at all times.
- 4. Gum, food, and drinks are not allowed in the Choir Room as they pose a serious health risk and can damage choir property.
- 5. Raise your hand and wait to be called on.

Consequences

- 1. Verbal warning
- 2. Conference with director after class
- 3. Removal from the days rehearsal (to complete book work)
- 4. 20 minute detention with phone call to coach and/or parent
- 5. Office referral

General MCMS Choir Policies



Class begins as soon as the bell rings, so we expect students in their place with folder, music, and pencil as the tardy bell begins ringing. If you are not in your place with your materials as the bell begins ringing, you will be counted as tardy.

We are very active and engaged throughout the class period and do not have time to stop and write passes to the bathroom. In addition to that, students are not permitted to leave the class in the **First or Last 15 minutes of class.** Please take care of your restroom needs between classes. If you must use the restroom during class, each student will be allowed 2 bathroom uses per 6 weeks.




When you enter the choir room,

Take only your choir folder and a pencil with you to the risers. You may leave your backpacks and all other belongings in the cubbies located in the shared music space. <u>Cell phones MUST be left at the charging station</u> and may not be visible in the choir room or they will be taken and turned into the office.

Please mark in your music in pencil only.



Chewing gum is not allowed at any time. We have BRAND NEW facilities and equipment at MCMS. Bringing chewing gum that could be left underneath chairs or around the room is unacceptable.



^{*}Any serious behavior that compromises the safety of the teacher or the learning environment of the students will result in an immediate office referral.

Contests and Auditions:

All-Region Choir

The Texas Music Educators Association (TMEA) sponsors regional auditions throughout the state for participation in select honor choirs. Students are chosen by panels of judges on the basis of ability and preparation. The selected students meet together on a Saturday to rehearse with a guest conductor, and then perform a concert that night along with the high school honor choir. Parents, family, and friends are invited and encouraged to attend this special concert. Some outside of school rehearsals will be available for those students, and parents are asked to encourage students to practice at home.

UIL Choral Concert and Sight Reading Contest

The University Interscholastic League (UIL), which is under the direction of the University of Texas at Austin, sponsors this contest. This contest is designed to rate the performance and sight reading skills of choirs throughout Texas. The choirs sing three selections in front of a panel of three judges and are given a rating of I - V. The choirs then proceed to a sight reading room where they perform a piece they have never seen before. A panel of three judges rates the performance. Attendance at this event is required for all eligible students.

UIL Vocal Solo and Ensemble

This is another UIL activity. The director helps students select a solo or ensemble piece and provides as much assistance as is reasonably possible to prepare students. Parents are again encouraged to monitor at-home practice. This contest consists of the soloist or ensemble performing a selection by memory in front of one judge. A rating of I - V, along with valuable suggestions, is given by the judge.

Eligibility Requirements:

According to Texas State law in order for students to participate in extracurricular activities, they must be passing all subjects at the end of each six weeks grading period. Students who are **ineligible** due to failing grades may regain eligibility at the end of the 3-week grading period if they are passing **ALL** classes at that reporting time. Once again, concerts and the UIL Concert and Sight Reading are considered by the state of Texas to be **CO-CURRICULAR** not extracurricular therefore all students are required to participate and will be graded on their attendance at concerts.

CHOIR FEES BREAKDOWN FORM

Choir Fees are absolutely necessary to the program and allow us to do all the wonderful things that we do. However, it is not the intent of the program to impose a crippling fee to hurt families or prohibit students from participating. If your family has extenuating circumstances that make paying this fee difficult, <u>PLEASE CONTACT THE DIRECTORS</u>. Payment plans can be set up and arrangements can be made to make sure that your student can participate. Simple failure to pay the fee without communication is NOT AN OPTION. Fees paid in either cash or check must be turned into the director in a SEALED ENVELOPE with the students NAME, GRADE, and CLASS PERIOD on it.

The Choir Fee Breaks Down as Follows:

\$20.00 - Choir Participation Fee

\$10.00 – Uniform and Dry-cleaning Fee (Contest Fee for 6th Grade)

- The Choir Dresses that the girls use and the pants that the boys wear cost money and need to be replaced due to wear over time. Additionally, Marine Creek Chorale must dryclean every Choir Dress to ensure that they are clean and ready to be re-issued every year. Boys need to purchase their shirt. (Once you purchase the shirt, you may re-use it for your 8th grade year)
- 6th Grade Choirs participate in the EMSISD Choir Festival. There are entry fees for the festival that are not covered in our budget

\$10.00 – Marine Creek Chorale T-Shirt

(Every choir student is required to have a shirt for off campus functions. Parents are more than welcome to support our choir by purchasing their own T-shirt at an additional \$10.00 per shirt)

\$5.00 – Pencil Bag Purchase

(Every choir student is required to maintain a pencil bag with 2 pencils and 2 different color highlighters in their choir folder throughout the entire year. This one-time purchase will give your student a zipper bag with their first 2 pencils and 2 highlighters.)
