Endorsements

An Endorsement is a focus of study that includes three or more classes in a cohesive sequence of four or more credits. Endorsements may be earned in any of the following five areas: STEM, Business and Industry, Public Services, Arts and Humanities, or Multidisciplinary Studies.

Performance Acknowledgements

A Performance Acknowledgement may be earned in any of the following: Dual Credit, Bilingualism/Biliteracy, AP/IB Score, College Readiness Assessment, or Certification.

Exit Exams

Each candidate for graduation must show mastery on all State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) End-of-Course Exams for the following courses: English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology, and US History.

Career & Technology Offerings

A large number of career & technology education courses are offered including Aerospace, Advanced Manufacturing Technology, Business Management & Administration, Engineering, Finance, Graphic Design & Animation, Health Sciences, Information Technology, Legal & Protective Services, and Robotics.
