Course Description

Our Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) program will teach students the knowledge and procedures to qualify as an EMT-B (Basic Life Support) to work alongside Paramedics on a 911 ambulance. In the late spring or early summer, qualifying students will have the opportunity to complete clinical shifts on 911 responding ambulances and in Emergency Departments.

Successful completion of this program permits the student to sit for the National Registry examination (<u>www.nremt.org</u>). After becoming nationally certified, students can then apply for a state certification to begin working (in Texas it is through the Texas Department of State Health Services).

EMT is a program offered in conjunction with Tarrant County College Northeast. The class will take place at the HCTC and is taught by HCTC instructors and Adjunct TCC instructors. All questions regarding program requirements and costs can be forwarded to:
