The Patient Care Technician (PCT) program prepares students to work alongside doctors, nurses, and other health care professionals to provide direct patient care in a variety of health care environments. During the PCT program students will develop a wide range of skills and knowledge to provide quality assessment and care for the patients. These skills will include patient care, comfort, and safety, electrocardiography (running ECGs), obtaining lab samples, and phlebotomy (drawing blood).
