Course Description

The Law Enforcement I course is an overview of the history, organization, and functions of local, state, and federal law enforcement.

Law Enforcement II is a continuation course. All classes will include ethical and legal responsibilities, operation of police and emergency telecommunication equipment, and courtroom testimony. Students will learn to respond to high-risk calls and can compete on a state level.

Certifications and Licensing- EMS ISD CTE will pay for one certification exam per student throughout the four years of high school. Students must meet course requirements and skill mastery prior to exam registration. Certification exams administered on EMS ISD premises will be paid for in advance by the district. Certification examinations which are held at off-site locations will require EMS ISD students to pay for the exam upfront. Students taking certification exam at an off-site location will be eligible for reimbursement upon verification of passing. Students who take certification examinations and are not successful are not eligible for reimbursement by EMS ISD CTE. Students who require reimbursement by the district will submit successful exam result verification to their EMS ISD CTE teacher. The EMS ISD CTE teacher will submit list of student names to campus financial secretary, who will begin the reimbursement process.

Transportation
