AP Scholar Awards

Award	Criteria
AP Scholar (50 Students)	Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams.
AP Scholar with Honor (10 Students)	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.
AP Scholar with Distinction (17 Students)	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.
National AP Scholar (5 Student)	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 4 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams
