



Emergency Services Program of Study

Prepare for your future in protective services through hands on coursework in emergency services, law enforcement, and forensic science.

RECOMMENDED COURSE SEQUENCE

1 Principles of Law, Public Safety, Corrections and Security (1 credit) (9th - 10th Grade)
Examine the roles and responsibilities of professionals in law enforcement, security, corrections and fire and emergency services. Explore the interconnectivity of local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

2 Anatomy and Physiology (1 credit) (11th Grade)
A comprehensive study of the structures and functions of the human body. This course includes dissections, study of the organization of organs and organ systems, and application of the scientific method in healthcare.

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2 Firefighter 1 Dual Credit (TCC Northwest) (2 credits) (11th Grade)
Analyze Texas Commission on Fire Protection rules and regulation, proper incident reporting and records, proper use of personal protections equipment and the principles of fire safety.

3 Emergency Medical Technician (HCTC) (2 credits) (12th Grade)
Think critically to develop skills needed to deliver emergency prehospital care. Students will have the opportunity to partner with TCC to complete the clinical portion of training prior to certification.
