The most effective way to prepare for STAAR Reading exam is to be a strong reader with the stamina to read longer passages and comprehend what is being read. The goal of this unit is to review the reading strategies that we have studied and help students apply those strategies to each genre that they have learned during the year. This unit is also about helping students think in logical and flexible ways in a high-stakes testing environment; they will need to stay focused, synthesize information, and connect ideas across a variety of texts and genres.

As writers, students have experienced multiple genres, and it is time for them to showcase their growth this year by celebrating their writing. Students will create a multi-genre project in which they will be the author and will choose their craft based on their purpose. Students will have the opportunity to apply everything they have learned as writers during this year.

During the final grading period, students will reflect on their growth as readers and writers as they review their reading skills and writing from throughout the year. They will produce a portfolio that includes all their writing and complete a written reflection. These reflections will be graded using a district-developed rubric. In addition, the students will also take the seventh grade STAAR Reading exam.

Although we are coming to the end of the year, students are still reading and writing daily. Be sure to check with them to hear about what is going on in class. Also, please continue to review your student's performance via Skyward Access and contact his or her teacher if you have any questions or concerns.
