

FAQs

Q: What is the difference between SAT/ACT School Day versus Saturday exam?

A: The ACT/SAT School Day is an exam opportunity that allows students to take the SAT/ACT on their home campus during a school day. EMS ISD had scheduled the ACT exam for March 24 and the SAT exam for March 25 for registered students. This exam opportunity was \$35.

The ACT/SAT National exam dates are offered on designated Saturdays at designated testing sites. These exams must be registered and paid for through the ACT/SAT website.

Q: Will the school day SAT/ACT be rescheduled?

A: Yes, it will be rescheduled for the fall.

Q: Will there be Saturday exams rescheduled for SAT/ACT?

A: Yes. Please see the ACT website at www.act.org or SAT www.collegeboard.org for updated exam dates.

Q: My student is a junior and will be applying to colleges this summer and the fall. How do I proceed to get my student ACT/SAT scores?

A: Please check the college admission requirements. Some colleges and universities are waiving the ACT/SAT requirement for 2020 and 2021 graduates, but please verify all requirements with the college/university. There will be a SAT/ACT school day in the fall at your campus. SAT/ACT will resume Saturday testing in August.

ACT/SAT Prep Academies

Q: My student did not get to finish the ACT/SAT prep academy at their home campus due to the building closures. Will these hours be rescheduled?

A: Students who did not finish the academy will be allowed to register for the summer academy at no cost. This program will be offered online. These students will be sent an invitation through email from their campus. For summer information, please contact Meredith Birdwell at mbirdwell@ems-isd.net.

Q: My student left their Princeton Review materials in the classroom before spring break. Can we retrieve those items?

A: Yes, please contact your College and Career Readiness Specialist on your campus to make these arrangements. Also, your student has access to online materials through Princeton Review.

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Refunds

Q: If I paid to take the SAT/ACT at my campus on March 24 and/or March 25, will I receive a refund (\$35) from the school district?

A: Yes, this process is being evaluated now. You will receive information directly from your campus in May when this process and timeline are finalized.

TSI

Q: My student is a senior and the college they have been admitted to is asking for TSI scores. How do I proceed if my student has not taken the TSI?

A: Please contact your college to work through any requirements and exemptions.

Q: My student needs to take the TSI for dual credit this summer. How do I proceed?

A: For students who completed the dual credit enrollment process for summer 2020, the College and Career Readiness Specialist on your campus will be contacting you directly.

Q: My student needs to take the TSI for dual credit for fall 2020 classes. How do I proceed?
