



COSMETOLOGY I and II

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Course Description

Cosmetology is a two-year licensing program designed to prepare junior and senior students for a career in the Cosmetology field. Students gain the skills to be hairdressers, hair stylists, colorists and chemical specialists, nail care technicians, skin care and make up professionals, and salon managers or owners. Along with these skills, students will study subjects such as microdermabrasion, product chemistry, and salon ecology; which includes bacteriology, sanitation, sterilization, and diseases associated with the cosmetology industry.
