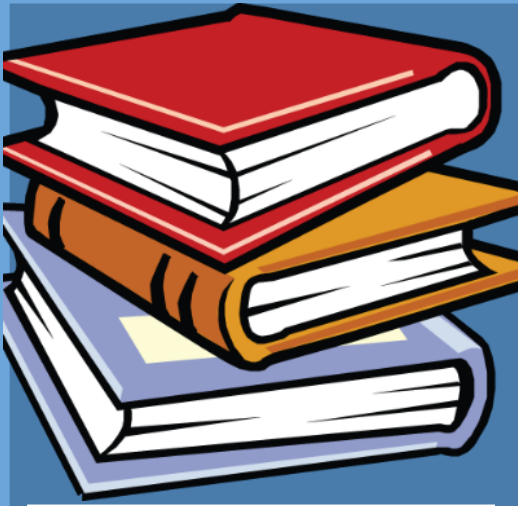


# Dual Credit

Earn College Credit While in High School



## AT A GLANCE

**ADMISSIONS:** All dual credit students must complete an Apply Texas application to TCC

\*Admissions should be complete by Jan. 31, 2019. Cannot add dual credit to schedule after Jan. 31.

**TESTS:** Students must meet minimum TSI requirements in Reading and Writing

\*Testing in February at SHS

**COST:** A 3-hour course is \$192 (\$64 per semester hour)

\*Price does not include textbooks

**WHAT:** Dual credit is an opportunity for students to take college-level classes while still in high school. Two credits are earned: TCC credit AND a high school graduation requirement for most classes.

**WHO:** Dual credit courses are most often taken by students in the 11th and 12th grades. Successful dual credit students are motivated and self-disciplined. *There are special admissions requirements for 9th and 10th grade students.*

**WHERE to SIGN UP:** Any student interested in dual credit will need to complete an enrollment packet, as well as include the course requests in Xello. Enrollment packets and copies of the dual credit handbook can be found in the College and Career Center, as well as online on the College and Career Readiness webpage. *Be aware there are specific requirements that must be met before a student can enroll in a dual credit class.*

**COURSES:** Traditionally, the following classes are offered on the Saginaw High School campus.

- ◆ English Composition I (ENGL 1301)
- ◆ English Composition II (ENGL 1302)
- ◆ British Literature II (ENGL 2323)
- ◆ American Literature I (ENGL 2327)
- ◆ US History I and II (HIST 1301 and HIST 1302)
- ◆ US Government (GOVT 2305)
- ◆ Macroeconomics (ECON 2301)

**WHY:** Earn transferable college credit, experience a class environment taught by a college professor, save money by avoiding campus fees
