Grade Level Goals:

By the end of this course students will be able to...

- 1. Read, write, and represent numbers from 0-20, compare numbers up to 20, and count forward and backward to at least 20.
- 2. Decompose numbers within 10 and solve word problems using objects and drawings to find sums up to 10 and differences within 10.
- 3. Self-select texts on grade level (instructional level D) and interact with those texts independently for increasing periods of time.
- 4. Use beginning reading and writing skills to communicate, decode, and spell.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for kindergarten is as follows:

- Standards based report card, based on mastery of standards (TEKS) assessed/observed by teacher
- Students will get feedback on report card in the core content areas of Math, ELAR, Science, and Social Studies. The reporting categories are as follows:

| Category | Description |

| 3 | Meets standard |
| 2 | Approaching standard |
| 1 | Area of concern |

Assignments, Exams, Expectations Outside of the Classroom:

- Students will complete assignments by giving due date.
- Students will read or be read to for 20 minutes nightly.
- Students will complete a minimum of 30 minutes of Istation weekly.
- Try your best and be patient and kind.

Attendance/Tardy Policy/Make-Up Work:

Attendance – Daily attendance will be taken, and compulsory attendance will be followed. If a student is not present in the building, the normal truancy process will be followed (TEC, §25.092). Students must be present for 90% of the required days of learning to be promoted to the next grade level or receive credit towards graduation, if in high school. Notes for absences should be turned in to the office or the students teacher.

Make-Up Work – All students shall be allowed to makeup work when they are absent from class. Students shall have a time equal to days absent from class plus one day to complete all missed assignments. Under extenuating circumstances such as long-term illness or family emergencies, teachers will work with the student to determine the due dates for make-up work missed. Teachers may reduce the length or number of assignments as long as the appropriate TEKS are covered.

Classroom Expectations:

- Participate in activities
- Check Take home folder EVERY NIGHT and behavior calendar (When in class)
- Follow expectations for behavior both in Teams and in Class for when we are back.

Academic Integrity:

Academic integrity values the work of individuals regardless if it is another student's work, a researcher, or author.
