Grade Level Goals:

Students who complete first grade successfully will be able to:

- Read and comprehend grade level text
- Ask and answer appropriate questions about a text
- Recall and retell events from a story
- Understand basic rules of addition and subtraction
- Solve words problems up to two-digit numbers
- Tell time to the hour and half hour
- Count money

Student Evaluation:
