Student Evaluation:

The grading system for Physical Education is as follows:

Everyone will start each nine weeks with an E for excellent. If a student must sit out during their gym class time for not following expectations after repeated reminders, they will fill out a slip of paper explaining what they did and bring it home that same day. So, please make sure to check their folders every night. I will also keep record of students sitting out, so we are all on the same page. Here is how my grading policy works:

E = zero or one time sitting out

S= two or three times sitting out

N= four or five times sitting out

U= six or more times sitting out

If a student must sit out for any reason, it will never be any longer than their age. For example, a five-year-old will sit out for five minutes. Most of the time it is shorter because I ask them to sit and show me that they are ready to come back and join the group. This usually only takes a couple minutes but is long enough for them to have a cool off period.
