Grade Level Goals:

Students who complete this course successfully will be able to:

- ELAR**
- Students will read and comprehend on target level and use an increasingly flexible range of strategies
 - Students will demonstrate thinking within the text, including retell of important events or details
- Writing**
- Students will use knowledge of sounds to spell
 - Students will write legible and use appropriate spaces, capitalization, and punctuation

Student Evaluation

The grading system for kindergarten is as follows:

- Standards based report card, based on mastery of standards (TEKs) assessed/observed by teacher
- Students will get feedback on report card in the core content areas of Math, ELAR, Science, and Social Studies. The reporting categories are as follows

Classroom Expectations:

- Students will be on time and ready to learn
 - They should be dressed and have eaten breakfast before 7:30
- Students will be respectful
- Students will participate and do their best work.
 - Be seated in a place that supports listening and learning
- Students are encouraged to read 15 minutes a day
 - (let teacher know if you need reading material)
- Check email daily for updates from your teacher, school, and district

Expectations outside of classroom:

Students will be given a weekly homework assignment. Students are expected to complete one math assignment, read (independently or being read to) for 20 minutes, and review sight words each night.

Attendance/ Tardy Policy:

The doors at school open at 7:05 and school begins promptly at 7:30. If your student arrives after 7:30am, he/she is counted **tardy** for the day. Please make every effort to drop your student off on time each day. We have a lot of learning to do in kindergarten and we begin our work as soon as the morning announcements are over.

If your child is **absent**, please send a note to school with him/her the next day explaining the reason for the absence. The office will keep the note for their records. Without a note, the absence will be considered unexcused. If your child is out for part of the day due to a doctor/dental appointment, please send a note from the doctor's office so the absence can be counted as an excused absence.

Academic Integrity:
