Grade Level Goals:

Students who complete this course successfully will be able to:

Reading:

- Make a year or more growth on the Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System.
- Read at a level M or higher by the end of the year.

Writing:

Use capitalization and punctuation appropriately in writing.

Math:

Add and subtract with and without regrouping up to 1,000.

Science:

• Use hands on discovery (when applicable) to complete an investigation, collect data, and analyze the results for a specific concept in life science, earth science, and physical science.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for **grade level 2** is as follows:

- 40% daily assignments (formative) and 60% summative assessments
- Homework does not need to be graded; however, it should be reviewed for understanding. At teacher discretion, homework may count for a maximum of 10% of the 40% daily assignment weighting.
- A minimum of one daily grade per week should be recorded per core content area. At teacher discretion, there
 may be a greater number of daily grades; however, as appropriate, there may be weeks in which a daily grade
 may not be taken in every subject area.
- A minimum of one summative assessment grade per three weeks per content area must be recorded.
- Grades recorded should be reflective of a student's mastery of the TEKS taught during that grading period.
- Official grades will be in Skyward only and can be accessed by student and parent through Family Access.

Assignments, exams, expectations outside of the classroom:

Students are expected to:

- Read for a minimum of 20 minutes independently, daily.
- Complete weekly math homework assignments to be collected on Fridays.
- Check Purple Communication folder daily and have parent/guardian initial any notes from teacher.

Attendance/Tardy Policy/Make-Up Work:

- Students should follow their grade level daily schedule with school beginning at 7:20 am daily.
- Elementary attendance will be taken at 10:00am.
