Grade Level Goals:

By the end of this course students will be able to...

1. Read, write, and represent numbers from 0-20, compare numbers up to 20, and count forward and backward to at least 20.
2. Decompose numbers within 10 and solve word problems using objects and drawings to find sums up to 10 and differences within 10.
3. Self-select texts on grade level (instructional level D) and interact with those texts independently for increasing periods of time.
4. Use beginning reading and writing skills to communicate, decode, and spell.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for grade level (K-1) is as follows:

- Standards based report card, based on mastery of standards (TEKS) assessed/observed by teacher
- Students will get feedback on report card in the core content areas of Math, ELAR, Science, and Social Studies. The reporting categories are as follows:

2	Approaching standard
1	Area of concern

Assignments, exams, expectations outside of the classroom:

Students are expected to:

- Complete all required assignments daily
- Read for a minimum of 10 minutes with a family member and/or independently
