Course Description:

Principles of Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security is a course that introduces students to professions in law enforcement, security, corrections, and fire and emergency management services. Students will examine the roles and responsibilities of police, courts, corrections, private security, and protective agencies of fire and emergency services. This course provides students with an overview of the skills necessary for these careers.

Course Goals:

Students who complete this course successfully will be able to:

- Understand what job opportunities are available within the Public Safety field.
- Understand Penal Code laws.
- Understand the real-world problems faced by professionals in Public Safety.

Topics included in Principles of L, PS, C, & S include, but are not limited to:

- Overview of Criminal Justice System
- Courts
- Roles of Public Safety Professionals
- Health & Safety
- History of Criminal Law
- Fire/EMS
- Private Security

- Interagency Cooperation
- Corrections

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for this course is as follows:

- Grade averaged 60% Major 40% Minor
- Major grades exams, projects, writing prompts, Employability; minimum three per six weeks
- Minor grades classwork, homework, participation, quizzes; minimum ten per six weeks
- Semester exams will count 1/7 of the semester grade
- A letter system (S, N, U) is used to report a student's conduct based on proper/responsive conduct and citizenship
- Per Board Policy EIA (LOCAL), "The District shall permit a student who meets the criteria detailed in the grading guidelines a reasonable opportunity to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student received a **failing** grade. This policy applies only to initial identified major grades and does not apply to daily assignments, quizzes, six-week test, and semester final examinations. Upon reteach and retest, the new test, project, etc. recorded will be a high score of 70%."

Assignments, exams, expectations outside of the classroom:

- Quizzes and exam will not be open-note.
- Homework may be assigned occasionally for this class.
- Each 6-week grading period will have at least one project, if not more. Projects will be completely individually.
- Supplies needed throughout the year for projects: 2-3 poster boards, one empty shoe box, and one empty cereal box.
- This class will also be reading the book *In Cold Blood* by Truman Capote, and will complete a compare/contrast writing assignment.
- Check Skyward Gradebook frequently. It is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to check gradebook for missing grades and/or low scoring grades.
- Review notes and course materials frequently.
- Come for tutorials if additional help is needed or retesting / make-up work is required.
