Course Description:

Spanish 1 and 2, Art 1A and 1B are courses that will be completed on **Edgenuity**. Spanish courses will consist of units that contain assignments, quizzes, and an exam after each unit. The Art classes will consist of lessons, quizzes, projects etc.

Course Goals:

Students who complete this course successfully will be able to: Learn the basics of Spanish grammar and culture. Learn to appreciate types of domestic and international art.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for this course is as follows:

- Updated grades can be accessed through the student log-in in Edgenuity.
- Manual progress reports will be mailed home every six weeks.
- We will follow the guidelines outlined in the District Grading and Reporting Handbook to ensure all students have the opportunity to be successful in their coursework.

Assignments, exams, expectations:

It is vital that you make academic progress everyday that will result in academic success! Expect to work on your schoolwork on average 5-7 hours a day. Your classroom participation will consist of you making necessary progress everyday in **Edgenuity** and completing assignments. Always remember, you are in charge of your own learning! If students are absent or missing assignments, the student is responsible for completing missing or tardy work.

Attendance/Tardy Policy/Make-Up Work: We will follow the district guidelines on attendance. On campus or Remote: I will have access to track your log in and activity in **Edgenuity**! If you score less than a 70% on a quiz or an exam, you will be allowed to make corrections. You have until the next unit or module to re-quiz or retest.

Classroom Expectations:

It is important that you follow a school routine that will result in academic success! Expect to work on your schoolwork on average 5-7 hours a day. Your classroom participation will consist of you logging onto **Edgenuity** and completing assignments. You will be expected to keep up with your daily **Edgenuity** progress on a paper form.
