The Edgenuity message system is the best method for contacting me. Access to Edgenuity and Office365 tools is available through our Single Sign-On Portal(SSO). Students will receive their SSO login during enrollment.

Course Description:

Congratulations on being selected to attend Watson. All science courses and Physical Education will located in classroom C-2. Watson is an accelerated campus, in which, in which you are given nine weeks to complete a half credit course, assuming you have that course once a day. If you have the course twice a day, you would be given four and a half weeks to complete the course. Some of you will have a course three times a day. In this case you will have three weeks to complete the course.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for this course is as follows:

- Grade averaged 60% Major 40% Minor
- Major grades tests (including District Common Assessments, projects, final essays, research papers, presentations); minimum three per six weeks
- Minor grades quizzes, daily assignments, journals; minimum four per six weeks
- Each six weeks will count as 1/6 and the semester exam will count as 1/7 of the semester grade.
- A letter system (S, N, U) is used to report a student's conduct based on proper/responsive conduct and citizenship
- Per Board Policy EIA (LOCAL), "The District shall permit a student who meets the criteria detailed in the
 grading guidelines a reasonable opportunity to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student
 received a failing grade. This policy applies only to initial identified major grades and does not apply to
 daily assignments and quizzes. Upon reteach and retest, the new test, project, etc. recorded will be a
 high score of 70%.
- Official grades will be in Skyward only and can be accessed by student and parent through Family Access.

Assignments, exams, expectations outside of the classroom:

Your assignments for all science and PE classes are in Edgenuity. You must meet your completion deadline to be successful. Additional expectations for your classes are as follows:

- Lessons can be reassigned.
- Any notes you have taken can be used on your quizzes. Quizzes can be reassigned.
- Any notes you have taken can be used on a unit test.
- A pretest can only be taken one time.
- I can assist you on lessons, but not on guizzes or tests.
- Cheating is unacceptable. Should you cheat, it may cost you retaking the assignment or retaking an entire course.
