Course Description:

Beginning Band students will learn how to read music, assemble their instrument, hold their instrument and produce a good fundamental tone. Students will continue to develop their instrumental abilities throughout the year. Beginning Band students will perform a winter concert, spring concert, spring festival and will have other performance opportunities throughout the year.

Course Goals:

Students who complete this course successfully will be able to demonstrate proper posture, hand position and characteristic sound on their instrument and the ability to read music at a beginning level. Students will also learn how to perform in a public setting.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for this course is as follows:

- Grade averaged 60% Major 40% Minor
- Major grades Participation, written tests, playing tests as assigned and concert performances
- Minor grades Class preparation. Quizzes, minor playing tests
- Semester exams will count 1/7 of the semester grade
- A letter system (S, N, U) is used to report a student's conduct based on proper/responsive conduct and citizenship
- Per Board Policy EIA (LOCAL), "The District shall permit a student who meets the criteria detailed in the grading guidelines a reasonable opportunity to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student received a **failing** grade. This policy applies only to initial identified major grades and does not apply to daily assignments, quizzes, six-week test, and semester final examinations. Upon reteach and retest, the new test, project, etc. recorded will be a high score of 70%.

Assignments, exams, expectations outside of the classroom:

Beginning Band students are expected to practice at home to reinforce class lessons and develop the muscle memory and motor skills necessary to learn how to play an instrument. Concert performances are required and will be considered a major grade unless excused by a director.

Attendance/Tardy Policy/Make-Up Work:

Students needing to make up missing assignments or playing tests will be given the opportunity to do so upon return from their absence. All Highland MS rules regarding Make Up work will apply.

Classroom Expectations:

Beginning Band students are expected to enter the classroom in an orderly manner. Band students are to come to class prepared with their instrument, music books/binder, pencil and any other necessary maintenance supplies. During class students are to demonstrate proper rehearsal etiquette.

Preliminary Schedule of Topics, Readings, and Assignments

Students will learn basic music theory, music terminology, and may be assigned playing tests.
