

Program FAQs:

What is the program's schedule?

Classes are concentrated on weekends and during the summer to allow leaders to experience high-quality, face-to-face interaction with faculty and fellow practitioners, while minimizing time away from their jobs. Cohorts begin each June.

What about the cost?

Through significant financial support from the School of Education, the cost of Baylor's EdD program is substantially less than that of other nationally ranked, private, doctoral-granting institutions.

Who are the faculty?

Program faculty members are senior scholars and distinguished practitioners in educational leadership positions. Faculty have experience as superintendents, principals, and college deans and presidents.

Focus on Problem Solving

Baylor's EdD prepares leaders within a character-based, ethics-informed framework for solving complex problems in educational practice, providing a strong knowledge base and teaching important analytical, management and leadership skills.

Cohort Model

In Baylor's program, students advance alongside colleagues in a cohort of educational leaders. This model provides an enriched and cooperative learning experience that highlights the currency of study and builds teamwork and networks.

Mentored Clinical Experience

Students benefit from a field experience addressing complex problems of practice, guided by a veteran educational executive.

Blend of Theory and Practice

All coursework ties theory to practice, culminating in a capstone experience. Through the dissertation-in-practice, students address real-life problems in education, applying knowledge by analyzing data, developing a plan for implementation, and persuasively presenting the data-based solution.

Distinctive Coursework

Baylor's EdD program focuses on change leadership, including coursework in core topics such as strategic financial management, innovation and reform, and learning accountability.

Doctorate in K-12 Educational Leadership

Courses are concentrated on weekends and during the summer to allow leaders to experience high-quality, face-to-face interaction with faculty and fellow practitioners. Cohorts begin each June; applications preferred by Feb. 1.
