ENROLLING STUDENTS FROM HOME SCHOOL OR ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION  
NON-ACCREDITED SCHOOLS

CRITERIA TO BE MET Eagle Mountain-Saginaw ISD does not accept high school credit earned through home schooling or non-accredited schools of an unknown academic profile without validation of the student's work and course content by school and/or district representatives. In order for credits from the aforementioned settings to be awarded, the following criteria must be met:

Parent(s) must provide documentation of the curriculum followed and work completed by the student in each subject area must be provided. Examples of documentation include:

Curriculum followed

Lesson or unit plans  
Course syllabi  
Course goals and objectives  
Course scope and sequence

Work completed

Tests and Results  
Journals  
Videos  
Portfolios  
Laboratory reports  
Art Work  
Projects

Transcript received from a non-accredited school, home school, private school or organization (IF APPLICABLE).

REVIEW OF COURSEWORK Curriculum and coursework will be reviewed by department coordinators of the core academic subjects (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies) to determine placement and possible awarding of credit. Elective credit will be awarded on a case-by-case basis.

METHODS OF AWARDING CREDIT Credit can be awarded via the following methods:

Department or End-of Course exam offered by English, Math, Science, Social Studies and Foreign Language departments to demonstrate mastery of a particular subject.

Credit by examination or correspondence course in each individual subject area per semester. Your child's counselor must approve all credit by exam and correspondence courses. Please note that credit by exams and correspondence courses do not count toward the student's GPA.

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Sequential awarding of credit- Example: Student is placed in English 2 at Saginaw High School. We will award credit for English 1 taken at a non-accredited or home school if student passes English 2 at Saginaw High School. Please ask your counselor or the registrar to see which courses are sequential.

School personnel feel that home school or private school curriculum is satisfactory enough to award credit with evidence of student's work/documentation of grade reports.
